

OPERA CLUB

The November meeting of the Four Seasons Opera Club will be in The Lodge Theater on Friday, Nov. 8 at 6 pm when we will present Beethoven's *Fidelio*.

Beethoven's sole opera is the great masterwork of the genre. Yes, I'm biased. If we try to describe operas with a single word we may say that *Madama Butterfly* is "heart-breaking" and *Carmen* is "fiery." In that thought exercise, *Fidelio* is "profound." *Fidelio* explores two topics central to our human existence. The

first is marital love. Indeed, the full title is "Fidelio, or the triumph of marital love." The other topic is freedom from oppression. Beethoven wove these two themes together with his brilliant music and theatricality. Because these themes are universal and outside of time, *Fidelio* has been set in many time periods and locales.

The opera features a quartet, "Mir ist so wunderbar," early in the opera that is one of the most sublimely beautiful musical passages ever written, performed and heard. Later in the first act there is an equally beautiful and moving chorus, "O welche lust." In this, The Prisoners Chorus, the political prisoners are gifted by the warden with a few moments of sunlight after years of damp, darkness, and solitude.

The greater profundity of the opera unfolds as the protagonist, *Fidelio*, achieves her goal of freeing her captive husband. And there is even more depth to explore. Please visit the Opera Club website at yukito.net to learn about the thread that starts in the Age of Enlightenment in the mid-17th century and connects from Mozart and Schikaneder (*Magic Flute*) to Beethoven and Schiller through the fall of the Berlin Wall and to Leonard Bernstein at the end of 1989.

Of all the operas presented thus far, *Fidelio* demands homework in advance. You will find the resources for that purpose on the website page for the show, yukito.net/2411-Fidelio.htm.

Finally, a reminder that in December we will present our opera offering, *Amahl and the Night Visitors* on the 13th and *The Nutcracker* on the 20th. This ballet is the first of what is intended to be an ongoing feature of the Opera Club.
